## What Goes Into the Recycling Bin?

New Items in Blue !

### ONLY THESE ITEMS GO INTO THE BIN!

PLEASE — NO FOOD OR TRASH !

#### ALUMINUM & METAL CANS

Clean foil & foil containers

No Aerosol Cans



#### GLASS BOTTLES & JARS

No BLUE glass, lids or caps



#### PAPER PRODUCTS

Office, Cardboard ( 18" x 24"max ), Paperboard boxes, Newspaper, "Junk" Mail, Catalogs, Phone books, Magazines, Paper Milk, Juice, & Soup Cartons (please empty and rinse containers)

Nothing foil or food-coated



#### PLASTIC BOTTLES & CONTAINERS

Plastic Lids & caps

are OK!



**MONROE COUNTY NOW ACCEPTS PLASTICS WITH # s 1—7**



Look for the recycling symbol !

**DO NOT PUT PLASTIC BAGS IN BINS!**

Check local supermarkets for plastic bag recycling bins.

Recycle Plastic Packaging like bubble wrap and packaging foam at local shipping stores.

**BATTERIES:** Car, Boat, Tool, and Household are accepted at Transfer Stations/Recycling Centers during regular hours!

## What Happens to Yard Waste ?

Monroe County Solid Waste mulching was discontinued several years ago due to limited demand, disease and contamination concerns. Check with you local service provider (see other side of brochure for phone numbers) to find out whether yard waste is still being separated in your neighborhood. ## Household Hazardous Waste and Electronic Waste Disposal

Household Hazardous Waste (HHW) and Electronic Waste (e-waste) requires special disposal because they can pollute the earth, air and water.


Disposal / recycling is FREE FOR RESIDENTS.  
(some limits and fees may apply)

Business waste is accepted for a fee.

## Household Hazardous Waste (HHW)

- Paints, stains, strippers, wood preservatives 
- Roof tar & patching compounds
- Adhesives, putty and caulk
- Auto/marine maintenance/care products
- Fiberglass & epoxy resins
- Solvents — acetone, mineral spirits, etc.
- Hydraulic fluids, anti-freeze, gasoline
- Corrosives (muriatic acid, lye, etc)
- Pesticides, fertilizers and weed killer
- Household and drain cleaners
- Pool Cleaning products;
- Lighter Fluid and/or lighters with fluid.

## Electronic Waste (e-Waste)

- Televisions, monitors, computers
- FAXES, printers, copiers
- Cell phones, radios, speakers
- Discs, video cassettes, DVD/VCRs
- Fluorescent bulbs
