Administrative and Fiscal Stability

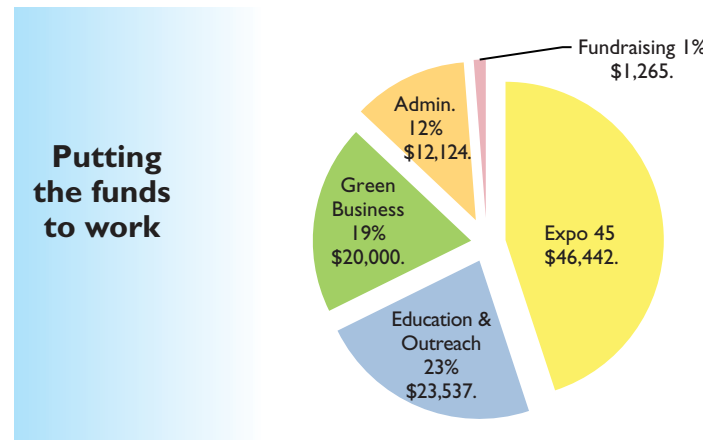
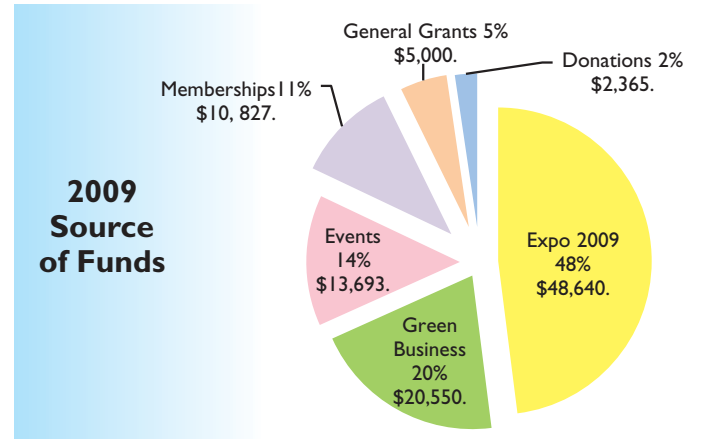

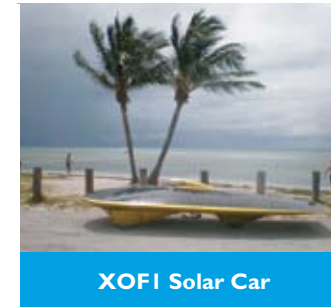
